

The Greenwich Bursary - 2019/20 – Assessment and Awarding Process

The Greenwich Bursary

A bursary of up to £700 for one year only, paid in two instalments of £350 for new undergraduate students entering their first year of study – Year 0 or 1.

Eligibility Criteria

- Undergraduate Full Time and Part Time Students new to the University in 2019/2020
- Studying at one of our three campuses: Greenwich, Avery Hill, Medway (except Medway School of Pharmacy) or one of our Partner Colleges
- If studying with a Partner College the tuition fee must be paid directly to the University of Greenwich (UoG)
- Undertaking a BA/BEd/BSc/LLB/BEng/MEng or MMath programme
- Assessed to pay fees at home rate and be paying fees of over £6,165 per annum full time rate.
- Be financially assessed by Student Finance England (SFE) and to have given consent to share to information between SFE and the University of Greenwich (UoG).
- Household income of £25,000 or less.
- Part time students must be undertaking at least 60 credits in their first year of study – Year 0 or 1.

Assessment/Awarding Process

- Assessment will be carried out automatically
- Shared data from the Student Finance portal will be used to filter out students whose household income is £25,000 or less.
- The assessment process for the first payment will be carried out from 1st November 2019.
- The assessment process for the second payment will be carried out from 1st February 2020.
- The first payment will be paid to the students Aspire card by 8th December 2019.
- The second payment will be paid to the students Aspire card by 1st March 2020.
- Students will be contacted by the Student Finance and Financial Support team to confirm their award.
- Part Time students will receive a single payment of £350 paid in their first year of study only.
- To receive a second and/or final payment the student must remain registered and in attendance on their program at the UoG

Ineligible students

- PGCE students
- Pre Reg Nursing students
- Sponsored students
- Studying Equivalent or Lower Level Qualifications (ELQ)
- Direct Entry Students
- Direct Apprenticeship students
