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Childhood and Youth Studies: Education Pathway

From September 2019 you will be able to elect to study the education pathway, resulting in a final degree of a BA Hons Childhood and Youth Studies (Education) instead of a BA Hons Childhood and Youth Studies. The education endorsement gives you the opportunity to develop a more in-depth understanding of education in the context of children and young people.

About the programme

The programme will comprise of the same total number of credits as the BA Hons Childhood and Youth Studies. However, the assessments will have an education focus in all three years of the programme.

In Year One, you will have focused assessments in Psychology of Childhood (30 credits) and Preparation for CYS: Scholarly and Academic practice (30 credits).

Year Two will include focused education based assignments in the modules: Adversity, Diversity and Special Educational Needs (30 credits) and Personal and Professional Development (30 credits).

In Year Three the core module is the Enquity Project and you will be expected to focus your enquiry project on a key aspect of education and to undertake two option modules including ECS: Negotiated Study: Work Based Learning (30 credits) and Creativity, Inclusivity, Pedagogy and Practice (30 credits).

Please note that Negotiated Study: Work Based Learning includes a placement and is subject to satisfactory safeguarding checks including a DBS check. You are expected to cover the cost of necessary safeguarding checks undertaken by the university (currently £53). We do not charge you for the occupational health check, but your GP may make a charge for completing the declaration form. If you are not able to provide satisfactory checks, you will need to return to the BA Hons Childhood and Youth Studies pathway.

How to apply

Interested applicants should apply to study for the BA Hons Childhood and Youth Studies and elect to study the Childhood and Youth Studies (Education) Pathway upon commencement of their studies.
