## Alumni Postgraduate Award

- Level: Postgraduate

An award of £1,000 is available to our graduates who progress to a non-government / research-funded master's or PGCE teacher training course at the University of Greenwich.

You must have completed an undergraduate degree, certain short courses or an exchange programme at one of our main campuses or Partner / Network Colleges.

The award can be redeemed in addition to a prompt payment discount (where payment is made in full at registration). The prompt payment discount is available on the amount due after the Alumni Scholarship has been applied.

If you receive (or are due to receive) a First of Upper-Second Class degree, you may be eligible for our [Fast-Forward Master's](#) award, worth £5,000.

The following students are not eligible for this scholarship:

- MPhil and PhD students
- Students at the Medway of School of Pharmacy.
- Students in receipt of the Fast Forward Master's Scholarship or any other specific award (e.g. China or Nationality Scholarship).

## Care Leaver Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

The Care Leaver Bursary provides £1,500 per year to undergraduate students who are joining the university directly from local authority care.

This bursary is offered as part of our commitment to accessibility and widening participation for higher education.

It is worth £1,500 per year for up to three or four years (depending on the length of your course). It is paid in cash and does not need to be repaid.

You get a further £200 in the final year to support the costs of attending graduation.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Care Leaver Bursary:

- You are a UK student aged 25 or under.
- You have been in the care of the local authority for at least 52 consecutive weeks immediately prior to the start of your University of Greenwich course.
- You are an undergraduate student at any of our three campuses or Partner Colleges, where your tuition fees are paid directly to the University of Greenwich.
- You qualify for the maximum level of means-tested government maintenance or special support grants.

- A signed letter on local authority headed paper from your leaving care team which confirms your previous care arrangements.

### Conditions

- Eligible part-time students will receive this on a pro-rata basis subject to the number of credits they are studying.

## Chevening Scholarships

- Level: Postgraduate
- Fee Status: International

**Chevening Scholarships enable outstanding emerging leaders from around the world to pursue a one-year master's degree in 2020/2021. The award includes flights, accommodation and course fees.**

Chevening Scholarships are available for international students with at least two years' work experience to study a one-year master's course on a full-time basis. The scheme welcomes applications that demonstrate your capability to excel at master's level and your visions for your future (and perhaps your home country's future).

### Am I eligible?

To be eligible for a Chevening Scholarship, you must:

- Be a citizen of a Chevening-eligible country or territory.
- Return to your country of citizenship for at least two years after the course has ended.
- Have fulfilled the entry requirements of a UK master's course by the time you submit your application. This is typically equivalent to an undergraduate degree with upper second-class (2:1) honours.
- Have at least two years' [work experience](#).
- Apply to three different eligible UK university courses and have received an unconditional offer for one of these by 16 July 2020.
- Meet the Chevening [English language requirement](#) by 16 July 2020.

There are some further conditions that may render you ineligible for an award.

## Commuter Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate

**Our commuter bursaries support new students from low-income households who face challenging travel costs to attend university.**

The bursaries are worth 50% of your monthly commuting cost between home and university up to **£1,000 per academic year**. We expect these costs will mostly arise from public transport.

However, we can consider supporting petrol costs if you can demonstrate why travel by car is necessary (e.g. you live in a rural area with limited public transport).

We also support cycling and will support an application for a bicycle and safety equipment.

The commuter bursary is funded by our Hardship Fund and there are a capped number of awards. We offer these on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Am I eligible?

To be eligible for a commuter bursary, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- You are a fully registered student at the University of Greenwich starting in September 2020.
- You are studying at one of our campuses (Greenwich / Avery Hill / Medway).
- You can demonstrate or show evidence of regular commuting costs.
- Your household income is below £25,000.
- If you are studying an undergraduate course, you will receive the full maintenance loan from Student Finance England.
- If you are studying a postgraduate course, you will receive a postgraduate loan and you have a clear plan for paying your course costs.

You must also consent to share information with the University to verify your entitlement to a commuter bursary.

You apply to our [Greenwich Hardship Fund](#), which opens in October until the spring of 2021.

## David Fussey Choral Exhibition Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee Status: Home, International

**The David Fussey Choral Exhibition Bursary is worth £1,000 per year for students who are selected to join the University of Greenwich Choir.**

The bursary is awarded in memory of Dr David Fussey, the late Vice-Chancellor of the University of Greenwich, who greatly enjoyed singing in choirs.

It is available to all students who audition successfully to join the University of Greenwich Choir.

The bursary is worth £1,000 per year for up to three years. Winners will be expected to perform a number of duties.

### How to apply

Unfortunately, we are not currently receiving applications for 2020/21 due to Covid-19 restrictions around large gatherings.

### Conditions

- A choral exhibitioner must remain an active member of the choir,
- You must attend all rehearsals and give support to the university's Music Director.
- In the second year, you will be responsible for publicity and general administrative tasks for the choir as required by the Music Director.

## Fast-Forward Master's Scholarship

- Level: Postgraduate
- Fee Status: Home

**Our Fast-Forward Master's Scholarships offer £5,000 to high-performing final-year undergraduates at the University of Greenwich to continue their studies at the university.**

The scholarships are available for a broad range of master's degrees for full-time and part-time study. They are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, and are conditional on students achieving a First or Upper-Second Class degree.

The £5,000 award is a discount against your course fees.

### Am I eligible?

To apply, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- You are a final-year University of Greenwich undergraduate student predicted to achieve a First or Upper-Second class degree.
- You are considered a UK national or an EU national resident in the UK paying Home fees.
- Your household income is below £43,000 for the 2020/21 academic year, which you can prove to the university.
- You must hold a conditional offer to study an eligible master's programme for 2021/22.

### Conditions

- If you elect to study part-time, the award is split across two years. The second payment is made subject to satisfactory progress.
- The Fast-Forward Master's cannot be combined with other fee waivers (e.g. the Alumni and First-Class Honours awards). But scholarship holders can apply for a postgraduate loan towards the cost of study.
- If you have an undergraduate loan from Student Finance England, please ensure SFE has consent to share your household income assessment with us.
- If you have funding from Student Finance Services European Team, Student Finance Wales, Student Finance Northern Ireland or the Student Awards Agency for Scotland, we will ask for documents from your funding provider to verify your household income.

## GREAt Skills Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

**We're all about great skills! If you participate in our GREAt Skills programme before you join us at the University, you could be eligible for a scholarship worth £2,000.**

We want to reward local students who prepare well for university by developing their independent learning and study skills before they start with us.

If you participate in our [academic skills programme](#) before you join the university, you may be eligible for a substantial cash scholarship of £2,000.

This is paid to you in three instalments during your first year.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the GREAt Skills Scholarship:

- You have been nominated by a member of staff at your institution
- You are a local student living in London, Kent or Medway, Essex, Sussex or Surrey or are a Child in Care/Care Experienced student under a Local Authority within one of these locations
- You have selected the University of Greenwich as a 'Firm' choice via UCAS.
- You are a new full-time undergraduate student paying the maximum tuition fee of £9,250.
- You'll be studying a BA, BEd, BSc, LLB, BEng, MEng or MMath course at our Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway Campus (not the Medway School of Pharmacy).
- You have completed at least 4 sessions of our GREAt Skills programme, or 3 sessions plus our online [Independent Learners' Toolkit](#). Live webinars do count as attendance, however, use of pre-recorded webinar resources do **not** count towards attendance.

## International Scholarships Award

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee Status: International

International students who hold an offer to study at the University of Greenwich could receive a tuition fee discount worth up to £3,000 in the first year.

We are one of the most international universities in the world, with students from over 140 countries. Our scholarship fund is available to support the best international applicants who have received a place to study a full-time undergraduate or taught postgraduate course.

Successful applicants will be awarded a tuition-fee reduction of between £500 and £3,000 for their first year of study.

### Am I eligible?

To apply, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- You have been offered a place to begin a course in September 2020 or January 2021.
- You will pay fees at the international rate.
- You are not receiving any other scholarships from the University or another source.

Students undertaking a two-year course that includes a work placement are not currently eligible for the award. However, any University of Greenwich International College (UGIC) students who are progressing to the university component of their course will be considered.

The **24 July** deadline is the last opportunity for applicants who will begin in September 2020. The **11 December** deadline is the last opportunity for applicants who will begin in January 2021.

Only successful applicants will be notified of a scholarship award. If you have not heard by the date above, please assume you have been unsuccessful.

### Main conditions

- You must have been offered a place on a full-time undergraduate or taught postgraduate course for the first time.
- You must be assessed as paying fees at the international rate.
- Payment of this award is by way of a tuition fee reduction for the first year of study. Students must pay the full cost of tuition in subsequent academic years.
- Applicants must not be in receipt of any other award such as a bursary or scholarship. For Greenwich alumni, we offer a separate alumni scholarship.
- Students taking a two-year course that includes a work placement will not be eligible for the 2020/2021 academic year.
- Recipients of the award will participate in university promotional activities, such as interviews and attending university events.

## International Travel Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee Status: International

The International Travel Bursary is designed to help students with the cost of flights to London where price has increased dramatically due to COVID-19.

The bursary is worth **up to £500** towards the increased cost of flights to London. It will be awarded as a cash payment to new or current students who meet the relevant criteria.

### Am I eligible?

You must meet the following criteria.

- You are a new or returning international student (overseas for fee paying purposes) from one of the following regions:
  - South Asia
  - Africa
  - Middle East
  - Central Asia.
- You flew to the UK between August and October 2020.
- You will begin in-person teaching by **09 October** (where no quarantine restrictions apply) or by **23 October** if you have travelled from a country where restrictions apply.
- You are a fully-registered student at the University of Greenwich with no fee holds on your account.

## John McWilliam Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

If you're an undergraduate student enrolled on certain courses in Architecture and Landscape, the John McWilliam Bursary could offer you £1,000 during each year of your studies.

There are five bursaries available each year, worth £1,000 for each year of study. (Payment in later years is dependent upon good progress.) The bursary can be used to fund educational costs that may not be met by other grants and awards. These include opportunities to travel overseas as part of your course.

The bursary was established in memory of our former Deputy Vice-Chancellor, John McWilliam.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the John McWilliam Bursary:

- You are a full-time undergraduate UK student.
- You are entering Year 1 of your course as a new student.
- You are studying an eligible course within the School of Design and Landscape on one of the university's main campuses (Avery Hill, Greenwich or Medway).

### Conditions

- Payment in Years 2 and 3 is dependent upon successful progression, with a minimum grade average of 50%.
- Priority is given to applicants who have lived for three years in a borough that is local to our campuses (e.g. Royal Borough of Greenwich, Bexley, Lewisham, and the Medway Towns area).
- Bursary holders write a report at the end of each academic year detailing their progress.

## Online Access Fund

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate

**New undergraduate or postgraduate students with low household income can apply for financial assistance towards equipment to support online learning.**

Remote learning and virtual campuses have become an important part of life for higher education students. We appreciate that not all our students may be able to access our virtual learning spaces.

For 2020/21, we have dedicated funds to ensure that those without access to technology can apply for support towards the equipment they need to get online.

The Online Access Fund is funded by our Hardship Fund and there are a capped number of awards. We offer these on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Am I eligible?

To be eligible for the Online Access Fund you will need to meet the following criteria.

- You are a fully registered student at the University of Greenwich starting in September 2020, joining in Year 0 or Year 1.
- You are studying at one of our campuses (Greenwich / Avery Hill / Medway).
- Your household income is below £25,000.
- If you are studying an undergraduate course, you will receive the full maintenance loan from Student Finance England.
- If you are studying a postgraduate course, you will receive a postgraduate loan and you have a clear plan for paying your course costs.

You must also consent to share information with the University to verify your entitlement to the Online Access award.

### How to apply

We are not currently accepting further applications for the Online Access Fund. However, new students who are eligible for [The Greenwich Bursary](#) can use this fund to purchase equipment.

## Private Housing Bursary 2020-21

The new hardship fund is available from Monday 18 January. It is a one-off payment of £1,000 and is available to students who can demonstrate financial hardship and are in private rented accommodation. This is a limited fund and it will be awarded on a first come first serve basis.

A boost of £255,000 is available to help private renters studying at the University of Greenwich during the COVID- 19 pandemic.

The new hardship fund is available from Monday 18 January. It is a one-off payment of £1,000 and is available to students who can demonstrate financial hardship and are in private rented accommodation.

This is a limited fund and it will be awarded on a first come first serve basis

## Private Housing Bursary 2020-21

You will need to meet the following criteria to be considered for the above grant:

- You are a fully registered student at the University of Greenwich.
- You are up to date with your fee's payments.
- You are studying at one of our campuses (Greenwich / Avery Hill / Medway).
- You pay your fees directly to the university.
- You must be able to demonstrate private housing costs by providing either:
  - Rent arrears statement
  - Tenancy agreement
  - Housing contract
  - Evidence of any housing benefit or Universal credit awarded towards rent.
- You must provide 3 months bank statements for all accounts (if you are in relationship this will include your partners).
- [You must fully complete and return this budget planner](#)
- You must provide short statement outlining;
  - your housing situation, for example details about any additional costs due to the pandemic
  - unexpected changes in your financial position, for example loss of income
- Any money awarded from the grant will be considered if a student applies to our student hardship fund.
- Assessment will be carried out by comparing income and rental costs
- Successful students will receive a one off payment of £1,000 paid directly into their bank account which can be updated on the portal.

## Robert Holman Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

**This award is worth £1,000 for current students studying Accounting and Finance courses from Greenwich, Lewisham and Southwark.**

We welcome applications from current undergraduates studying one of our Accounting and Finance degrees. A bursary of £1,000 is available for one second-year student and one third-year student.

This will help you focus on your studies and/or to engage in new and varied activities to support your future career options.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Robert Holman Bursary:

- You are entering the second or third year of an undergraduate degree [in the area of Accounting and Finance](#).

Priority will be given to those from (and residing in) **Greenwich, Lewisham** or **Southwark** boroughs, but applicants from other boroughs will be considered.

### Conditions

- Winners will be asked for a testimonial outlining the impact of the donation.
- Winners will be required to attend the Annual Supporter Showcase (date TBC).

### Further information

The bursary is a gift from the Robert Holman Memorial Trust for students from the Greenwich, Lewisham or Southwark boroughs. Robert Holman gained a degree in economics which led to a successful career as a Chartered Accountant and partner with Ernst and Young.

The University of Greenwich is founded on philanthropy and an ambition to remove barriers to education. We are grateful to the Robert Holman Memorial Trust for their ongoing commitment to our students.

## Royal Navy and Royal Marine Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

This bursary provides up to £3,000 per year for undergraduate students who have served in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, or whose parents have a record of service.

This bursary is offered by The Crown Charity, Greenwich Hospital, to support former serving members and/or their sons or daughters. It offers up to £3,000 towards the academic costs of an undergraduate degree.

Grants are means-tested and are normally awarded for one academic year. Depending on your circumstances, Greenwich Hospital may extend the award for up to four years.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Royal Navy and Royal Marine bursary:

- You are an undergraduate student at any of our three campuses or Partner Colleges.
- You are a former serving member of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, or the son or daughter of a serving or retired member.
- You or your parents have served a minimum of three years in the relevant force.
- You must have applied for student support, where applicable.
- Your household income must be less than £40,000.

The deadline for applications is **30 November** each year.

If you don't qualify for student support because you've studied previously or you're studying an [equivalent or lower qualification](#), please request an alternative application form.

### Conditions

- Payment of awards after the first year is dependent upon satisfactory progress.
- Payment during a placement or sandwich year depends upon the placement being unpaid.
- No award will be made in years of repeat study.
- The university must verify your household income with Student Finance England and share this information with Greenwich Hospital Charity as part of your application.

## Sir William Boreman's Foundation

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee Status: Home

**If you're a permanent resident in the Borough of Greenwich or Lewisham, you could qualify for a Sir William Boreman's Foundation grant towards your living costs.**

These bursaries are available for permanent residents of Greenwich and Lewisham to study undergraduate or postgraduate courses on a full-time or part-time basis. They can be used for daily living costs, travel, and books / equipment for your course.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Sir William Boreman's Foundation bursary:

- You are a permanent resident in Greenwich or Lewisham (for at least five years)
- You are under 25 years old.
- Your household income is below £30,000 per year.
- You are a UK national or have 'Settled' status under the Immigration Act 1971 (i.e. there are no restrictions on how long you can stay in the UK).

### How to apply

To enter for this academic year, the Foundation must receive your application **at least three weeks** before their meetings in November 2020, February 2021 and May 2021.

Applications must be sent by postal mail, so we recommend as follows:

- To be considered in February, post your application by **5 January 2021**.
- To be considered in May, post your application by **27 April 2021**.

### Further information

The charity originated from the 1684 will of Sir William Boreman. He bestowed to The Drapers' Company a school he had founded in Greenwich, adjacent land, and arrangements for the endowment of the school.

As the original school no longer exists, the endowment now benefits other young people in the London Boroughs of Greenwich or Lewisham. The charity awards grants worth around £90,000 each year to individuals from low income or disadvantaged backgrounds.

## Teacher training bursaries

- Level: Postgraduate
- Fee Status: Home

Interested in becoming a teacher? Teacher training bursaries will cover the cost of your training. Find out if you are eligible.

### Postgraduate Certificate in Education (Primary and Secondary)

Tax-free funding is available for graduates to undertake teacher training in England that leads to the award of qualified teacher status.

- You could get a £26,000 bursary or [scholarship](#), if you hold a bachelor degree (2:2 or above).
- Even without a bursary, you could receive a [tuition fee and maintenance loan](#) for your training.

The tables below reflect the available scholarships for **September 2020**.

### Bursaries and scholarships to teach mathematics

If you train to teach maths, you could get a **£26,000** tax-free bursary or a scholarship worth **£28,000**.

If you are awarded a bursary or scholarship, you will receive 3 additional [early-career payments](#) of £2,000 each (£3,000 for specified areas of England) in their second, third and fourth year of teaching.

### Scholarships and bursaries to teach physics, chemistry and languages (French)

To receive a bursary or scholarship, you must be entitled to support under the [Student Finance England](#) criteria or the equivalent in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

If you have a degree from outside the UK, you should refer to the [overseas degree equivalency table](#) to see the bursaries available. You can also contact your training provider about your eligibility.

Trainees in physics, chemistry, maths, and languages with a 2:1 or above may apply for a teacher training scholarship with the appropriate professional body. With a 2:2, you'll need significant experience.

## Teaching primary level mathematics

Trainees in primary level mathematics with at least a B grade in A-level mathematics (or equivalent) will be eligible for a bursary of £6,000.

## School Direct (salaried route)

For trainees on School Direct, the school pays your tuition fees and a salary. The amount depends on your location and subject. Trainees in maths or physics can earn up to £30,000 before deductions. School Direct trainees are not eligible for a bursary or scholarship, but may be able to receive support towards living costs from Student Finance England or another regional provider.

## BA Hons Primary Education with QTS

Students on the BA Hons Primary Education with QTS do not qualify for bursaries but may be eligible for a [tuition fee loan and maintenance loan](#).

## Early Years Teacher Status

The type and amount of financial support available depends on your eligibility and your highest relevant qualification.

### *Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (full-time)*

A £7,000 grant is available to cover course fees. There are also bursaries of up to £5,000 for graduates with a first class degree, £4,000 for graduates with a 2:1, and £2,000 for graduates with a 2:2.

### *Postgraduate Certificate in Education (employment)*

Funding of £14,000 is available: upto £7,000 for course fees; the remainder for costs incurred by your employer (e.g. supply cover or salary).

## Further Education, Life Long Learning (Full Time)

The DfE has announced a new series of incentives for [FE Initial teacher training](#). The total amounts available are limited and these incentives will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis:

Bursaries available for pre-service trainees and cover the following subjects to be taught:

- [Maths \(numeracy\)](#): £26,000
- [English \(literacy\)](#): £12,000

Grants available for in-service trainees worth £18,200 to the employer to cover the cost of the training and the release from teaching for English and Maths.

## How bursaries are awarded

We will send you an application form once you have accepted your offer of a place. During registration, we check this together with your degree awards in the Student Centre.

Bursary payments are processed by your chosen teacher training provider. They are released in 10 monthly instalments from October to July, once you are fully registered.

## The Ann Packer Sports Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

**If you're an elite sportsperson and decide to study a degree at the University of Greenwich, you could win a scholarship named after our Olympic gold medal-winning alumna, Ann Packer.**

The Ann Packer Sports Scholarships provide up to £3,500 (plus up to £500 in support services) per year for full-time students.

Scholarship holders will be paid in two instalments throughout the year. Continued support in further years is conditional upon evidence of sustained high performance.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be considered for the Ann Packer Sports Scholarship.

- You are a new full-time undergraduate starting in 2020/2021.
- You have selected the University of Greenwich as a 'Firm' choice via UCAS.

Priority will be given to applications from the following sports:

- basketball
- swimming
- table-tennis

If you meet the eligibility criteria, you must apply for the scholarship, together with evidence of your performance level and achievements.

### Conditions

## The Greenwich Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

The Greenwich Bursary is worth £700 for new undergraduate students with a low household income.

We are committed to supporting students from a variety of backgrounds. As part of this commitment, the Greenwich Bursary offers £700 to new undergraduate students entering Year 0 or 1 who meet the eligibility criteria.

You receive £350 onto an Aspire Card by December 2020. The second payment is made before 1 March 2021. The bursary is paid for one year only.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to receive the bursary.

- You are a fully-registered undergraduate student at the University of Greenwich.
- You'll be studying a BA, BEd, BSc, LLB, BEng, MEng or MMath course.  
You'll be studying at Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway Campus (except Medway School of Pharmacy) or one of our Partner Colleges where your tuition fee is paid directly to us.
- You are [assessed to pay fees](#) at the home rate at over £6,165 per year.
- You have been assessed by Student Finance England and have given consent for it to share your information with the University of Greenwich.
- Your household income is below £25,000.

### How to apply

**You do not need to apply for the Greenwich Bursary.**

This bursary is assessed and awarded automatically by the Student Fees and Funding Team.

### Conditions

- You are only eligible for **one** bursary or scholarship from the University of Greenwich. You will be awarded the highest-value award that you are eligible for.
- Part-time students must be taking at least 60 credits in their first year (Year 0 or 1). You receive a single payment of £350 in your first year. To receive a second payment, you must remain registered and in attendance on your course.

## The Sanctuary Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate

**This scholarship is for an offer holder seeking asylum or with refugee status in the United Kingdom. It covers tuition and accommodation costs, plus a maintenance grant.**

For 2020/21, we will offer two scholarships (undergraduate or postgraduate) to offer holders who are seeking asylum or have refugee status in the United Kingdom and are not eligible for financial support.

Successful scholars will receive:

- Annual tuition fee waiver
- Maintenance support of £5,000, paid in three instalments
- Annual accommodation fee waiver for Avery Hill Campus.

Once you are awarded a status that allows you access to student finance (tuition-fee loans, etc.), you no longer receive the scholarship in subsequent academic years.

### Am I eligible?

Applicants must meet **all** of the eligibility criteria outlined below to apply.

- You have been offered a full-time place on an undergraduate or postgraduate taught course at the University of Greenwich entering at year 0 or 1, commencing September 2020.
- You will be studying at one of our three campuses: Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway (except Medway School of Pharmacy).
- If studying with a Partner College, the tuition fee must be paid directly to the University of Greenwich.
- You are unable to access Student Finance (Tuition and Maintenance Loans) due to your current immigration status.
- You do not already hold a qualification that is equal to or higher than the course you are applying for.
- You are resident in the UK.

You must also be able to provide documentary evidence to verify your circumstances.

### Immigration status

To be eligible for the Sanctuary Scholarship, you must hold one of the following immigration statuses before you apply to study at the University of Greenwich:

- UK asylum seeker
- UK discretionary leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
- UK limited leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
- Humanitarian protection (as a result of an asylum application).

You will also be eligible if you are a dependant of someone with one of these immigration statuses.

## William Hills Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee Status: Home

The William Hills Scholarship offers six students £2,000 each year for the duration of their 4-year MEng Mechanical Engineering degree. An additional two awards are available for two students on year two of their BEng Mechanical Engineering degree.

The scholarship is available to full-time MEng Mechanical Engineering students, as well as students who transfer from the BEng Mechanical Engineering to the MEng in Year 3.

In 2020/21 two additional awards are available for BEng Mechanical Engineering students. They will be available for the best two performing students in Year 2.

The scholarships are awarded based on performance at the end of the first academic year.

### Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the William Hills Scholarship:

- You are a new entrant, studying the MEng Mechanical Engineering on a full-time basis at Medway Campus or you are studying the BEng Mechanical Engineering (Year Two only) also on a full-time basis at Medway Campus.
- You have at least 128 UCAS points from two or three A-Levels (including at least a B in A-level Maths). Level 3 Key Skills and General Studies are not included.
- Students on the BEng Mechanical Engineering who transfer to the third year of the MEng will also be eligible to receive the scholarship for their third and fourth years. These students will be identified and nominated by the Faculty.

### Conditions

- All award winners take part in Faculty-organised promotional activity in local schools and colleges to highlight the course and scholarship to prospective applicants.
- Winners must maintain a grade average of at least 60% through each academic stage to keep receiving the award.

## Further information

William Hills was an alumnus of the university who studied Mechanical Engineering at the former Woolwich Polytechnic. He was dedicated to the support and education of a new generation of engineers.

Following his own studies, he worked for the Royal Arsenal in Woolwich, eventually becoming the Chief Draftsman. It is through his work and generosity that, following his death, this scholarship was made available.
