Alumni Postgraduate Discount

- Level: Postgraduate

A discount of up to 20% is available to our alumni who progress to a non-government/research funded master's programme at the university having completed an undergraduate degree programme, certain short course programmes or an exchange programme at one of the university's main campuses, Partner, Network or Collaborative colleges.

This tuition fee discount is applicable to master's programmes undertaken in any of our faculties as follows:

20% Discount

Students holding a First or Upper Second Class degree

10% Discount

Students holding a Lower Second Class degree and those who completed an Erasmus placement with us

This discount is applicable to the full fee due. This bursary is available in addition to the prompt payment discount where payment is made in full at the time of registration. The prompt payment discount is only available on the amount due after the Alumni Scholarship has been applied.

This bursary is not available to students in the Medway of School of Pharmacy.

The following students are not eligible for this scholarship:

- MPhil and PhD students
- Students in receipt of the Fast Forward Master's Scholarship or any other specific award, such as the China or Nationality Scholarship.

Care Leaver Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

The Care Leaver Bursary provides £1,000 per year to undergraduate students who are joining the university directly from local authority care.

This bursary is offered as part of our commitment to accessibility and widening participation for higher education.

It is worth £1,000 per year for up to three or four years (depending on the length of your course). It is paid in cash and does not need to be repaid.

You get a further £100 in the final year to support the costs of attending graduation.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Care Leaver Bursary:

- You are a UK student aged 25 or under.
- You have been in the care of the local authority for at least 52 consecutive weeks immediately prior to the start of your University of Greenwich course.
- You are an undergraduate student at any of our three campuses or Partner Colleges, where your tuition fees are paid directly to the University of Greenwich.
- You qualify for the maximum level of means-tested government maintenance or special support grants.

- A signed letter on local authority headed paper from your leaving care team which confirms your previous care arrangements.

Conditions

- Eligible part-time students will receive this on a pro-rata basis subject to the number of credits they are studying.

David Fussey Choral Exhibition Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate; Postgraduate
- Fee status: Home; International

The David Fussey Choral Exhibition Bursary is worth £1,000 per year for students who are selected to join the University of Greenwich Choir.

The bursary is awarded in memory of Dr David Fussey, the late Vice-Chancellor of the University of Greenwich, who greatly enjoyed singing in choirs.

It is available to all students who audition successfully to join the University of Greenwich Choir.

The bursary is worth £1,000 per year for up to three years. Winners will be expected to perform a number of duties.

The deadline is **30 September**.

Students accepted for audition will be notified by the Music Director. Auditions are held in October.

Conditions

- A choral exhibitioner must remain an active member of the choir,
- You must attend all rehearsals and give support to the university's Music Director.
- In the second year, you will be responsible for publicity and general administrative tasks for the choir as required by the Music Director.

Fast-Forward Master's Scholarship

- Level: Postgraduate
- Fee status: Home

Our Fast-Forward Master's Scholarships offer £5,000 to high-performing final-year undergraduates at the University of Greenwich to continue their studies at the university.

The scholarships are available for a broad range of master's degrees for full-time and part-time study.

They are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, and are conditional on students achieving a First or Upper-Second Class degree. The £5,000 award can be claimed as a discount against course fees or as a cash bursary.

Am I eligible?

To apply, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- You are a final-year University of Greenwich home undergraduate student predicted to achieve a First or Upper-Second class degree.
- Your household income is below £43,000 for the 2018/19 academic year, which you can prove to the university.
- Applicants needs to have applied for the master's programme for 2019/20.

Conditions

- If you elect to study part-time, the award is split across two years. The second payment is made subject to satisfactory progress.
- The Fast-Forward Master's cannot be combined with other fee waivers (e.g. the Alumni and First-Class Honours awards). But scholarship holders can apply for a postgraduate loan towards the cost of study.
- If you have an undergraduate loan from Student Finance England, please ensure that SFE has consent to share your household income assessment with us.
- If you have funding from Student Finance Services European Team, Student Finance Wales, Student Finance Northern Ireland or the Student Awards Agency for Scotland, we will ask for documents from your funding provider to verify your household income.

GREAt Skills Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

We're all about great skills! If you take our GREAt skills programme before you start the university, you could earn a scholarship worth £2,000.

We want to reward students who prepare well for university by developing their independent learning and study skills before they start with us.

If you take part in our [academic skills programme](#) before you join the university, you may be eligible for a substantial cash scholarship of £2,000.

This is paid to you in three instalments during your first year.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the GREAt Skills Scholarship:

- You have completed at least 4 sessions of our GREAt Skills programme or 3 sessions of our GREAt Skills programme alongside your successful completion of our online resource, [Independent Learners' Toolkit](#).
- You have selected the University of Greenwich as a 'Firm' choice via UCAS.
- You are a new full-time undergraduate student paying the maximum tuition fee of £9,250.
- You'll be studying a BA, BEd, BSc, LLB, BEng, MEng or MMath course at our Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway Campus (excluding the Medway School of Pharmacy).

GREAT India Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee status: International

If you are resident in India and you hold an offer to study an eligible course at Greenwich, you could earn a scholarship to cover your first-year tuition fees. Apply by 12 May.

We want to give exceptional students from India the ability to access and further their education in the UK.

We will submit **three** nominees for scholarships that are joint funded by the British Council. These awards are the value of your first year's tuition fees.

Am I eligible?

To apply, you will need to meet the following criteria:

1. You must hold an Indian passport and be a resident in India when you apply
2. You must have completed all your previous studies in India
3. You must hold an offer to study one of the following courses on a full-time basis from September/October 2019.

Gurkha Personnel Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate; Postgraduate
- Fee status: Home; International

The Gurkha Personnel Bursary provides £1,000 per year to students who served, or have parents who served, in Gurkha military units within the British Army.

This bursary is available to undergraduate and postgraduate students, either full-time or part-time, who pay fees at the international rate.

You or a parent will have a record of service in the Brigade of Gurkhas.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Gurkha Personnel Bursary:

- You are an undergraduate or postgraduate student at any of our three campuses or Partner Colleges, where your tuition fees are paid directly to the University of Greenwich (not the Medway School of Pharmacy).
- You are assessed as paying tuition fees at the international rate.
- You serve, have served, or have a parent who served, in the Brigade of Gurkhas.

High Achievement Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

If you're a high-achieving student, come and study an undergraduate degree with us and you could win an award worth £2,000.

Our High Achievement Scholarship is for new incoming full-time undergraduates (entering Year 0 or 1) that have shown exceptional promise in their Level 3 qualifications. This award is worth £2,000 and is paid in three instalments.

You don't need to apply. If you're eligible, you automatically go into contention.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be considered for the scholarship:

- 200 UCAS points from Level 3 qualifications and a grade B/6 or above in GCSE English and Mathematics. We accept the listed EU equivalent qualifications only.
- You are a new undergraduate student paying Home/EU fees at the maximum rate of £9,250.
- You are studying a BA, BEd, BSc, LLB, BEng, MEng or MMath course at one of our three campuses, Greenwich, Avery Hill, or Medway (except the Medway School of Pharmacy), or a Partner College.

How to apply

You do not need to apply for the High Achievement Scholarship.

This bursary is assessed and awarded automatically if you meet the criteria.

Conditions

- You are only eligible for one bursary or scholarship from the University of Greenwich. You will be awarded the highest-value award you are eligible for.
- If you are studying with a Partner College, your tuition fees must be paid directly to the University of Greenwich.
- Part-time students must be taking at least 60 credits in the first year (0/1).

International Scholarships Award

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate
- Fee status: International

International students who hold an offer to study at the University of Greenwich could receive a tuition fee discount worth up to £3,000 in the first year.

We are one of the most international universities in the world, with students from over 140 countries.

A large scholarship fund is available to support the best applicants who have received a place to study a full-time undergraduate or taught postgraduate course.

Successful applicants will be awarded a tuition-fee discount of between £500 and £3,000 for their first year of study.

Am I eligible?

To apply, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- You have been offered a place to begin a University of Greenwich course in September 2019 or January 2020
- You will pay fees at the international rate.
- You are not receiving any alternative scholarships from the university or another source.

Students on a work placement during the 2019/20 academic year are not eligible to apply. However, University of Greenwich International College (UGIC) students who are progressing to the university component of their course will be considered.

Handwritten or scanned copies will not be accepted.

Key dates and deadlines

The International Scholarships Panel meets five times per year to consider applications. You can apply at any time, but we encourage you to apply as early as possible. The deadlines for application are:

- **15 March 2019** (for panel meeting 1 April)
- **17 May 2019** (for panel meeting 1 June)
- **19 July 2019** (for panel meeting 1 August)
- **18 October 2019** (for panel meeting 1 November)

- **15 November 2019** (for panel meeting 1 December)

Successful applicants will be notified within four weeks of the panel meeting.

Conditions

- You must have been offered a place on a full-time undergraduate or taught postgraduate course for the first time.
- You must be assessed as paying fees at the international rate.
- Payment of this award is by way of a tuition fee reduction for the first year of study. Students must pay the full cost of tuition in subsequent academic years.
- Applicants must not be in receipt of any other award such as a bursary or scholarship. For Greenwich alumni, we offer a separate alumni scholarship.
- Students on work placement are not eligible to apply.
- Recipients of the award will participate in university promotional activities, such as interviews and attendance at university events.

John McWilliam Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

If you're an undergraduate student enrolled on certain courses in Architecture and Landscape, the John McWilliam Bursary could offer you £1,000 during each year of your studies.

There are five bursaries available each year, worth £1,000 for each year of study. (Payment in later years is dependent upon good progress.)

The bursary can be used to fund educational costs that may not be met by other grants and awards. These include opportunities to travel overseas as part of your course.

The bursary was established in memory of our former Deputy Vice-Chancellor, John McWilliam.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the John McWilliam Bursary:

- You are a full-time undergraduate UK student.
- You are entering Year 1 of your course as a new student.
- You are studying an eligible course within the School of Design and Landscape on one of our main campuses (Avery Hill, Greenwich or Medway).

How to apply

Eligible students will be invited to apply for this bursary.

Conditions

- Payment in Years 2 and 3 is dependent upon successful progression, with a minimum grade average of 50%.
- Priority is given to applicants who have lived for three years in a borough that is local to our campuses (e.g. Royal Borough of Greenwich, Bexley, Lewisham, and the Medway Towns area).
- Bursary holders write a report each academic year detailing their progress.

Royal Navy and Royal Marine Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

This bursary provides up to £3,000 per year for undergraduate students who have served in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, or whose parents have a record of service.

This bursary is offered by The Crown Charity, Greenwich Hospital, to support former serving members and/or their sons or daughters. It offers up to £3,000 towards the academic costs of an undergraduate degree.

Grants are means-tested and are normally awarded for one academic year. Depending on your circumstances, Greenwich Hospital may extend the award for up to four years.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Royal Navy and Royal Marine bursary:

- You are an undergraduate student at any of our three campuses or Partner Colleges.
- You are a former serving member of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, or the son or daughter of a serving or retired member.
- Your or your parents have served a minimum of three years in the relevant force.
- You must have applied for student support, where applicable.
- Your household income must be less than £40,000.

Conditions

- Payment of awards after the first year is dependent upon satisfactory progress.
- Payment during a placement or sandwich year depends upon the placement being unpaid.
- No award will be made in years of repeat study.
- The university must verify your household income with Student Finance England and share this information with Greenwich Hospital Charity as part of your application.

Sir William Boreman's Foundation

- Level: Undergraduate; Postgraduate
- Fee status: Home

If you're a permanent resident in the Borough of Greenwich or Lewisham, you could qualify for a Sir William Boreman's Foundation grant towards your living costs.

These bursaries are available for permanent residents of Greenwich and Lewisham to study undergraduate or postgraduate courses on a full-time or part-time basis.

They can be used for daily living costs, travel, and books / equipment for your course.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the Sir William Boreman's Foundation bursary:

- You are a permanent resident in Greenwich or Lewisham (for at least five years)
- You are under 25 years old
- Your household income is below £30,000 per year
- You are a UK national or have 'Settled' status under the Immigration Act 1971 (i.e. there are no restrictions on how long you can stay in the UK).

You can apply at any time of the year. Applications are considered at meetings in November, February and June.

The Foundation needs to receive your application at least three weeks in advance of a meeting for it to be considered at that time.

Further information

The charity originated from the 1684 will of Sir William Boreman. He bestowed to The Drapers' Company a school he had founded in Greenwich, adjacent land, and arrangements for the endowment of the school.

As the original school no longer exists, the endowment now benefits other young people in the London Boroughs of Greenwich or Lewisham. The charity awards grants worth around £90,000 each year to individuals from low income or disadvantaged backgrounds.

Teacher training bursaries

- Level: Postgraduate
- Fee status: Home

Interested in becoming a teacher? Teacher training bursaries will cover the cost of your training at the University of Greenwich. Find out if you are eligible.

Postgraduate Certificate in Education (Primary and Secondary)

Tax-free funding is available for graduates to undertake teacher training in England that leads to the award of qualified teacher status.

- You could get a £26,000 bursary or [scholarship](#), if you hold a bachelor degree (2:2 or above).
- Even without a bursary, you could receive a [tuition fee and maintenance loan](#) for your training.

The tables below reflect the available scholarships for **September 2019**.

Scholarships and bursaries to teach mathematics

If you train to teach maths, you could get a **£20,000** tax-free bursary or a scholarship worth **£22,000**.

If you are awarded a bursary or scholarship, you receive two further payments of **£5,000** in your third and fifth year of teaching. In some local authorities in England, these payments are higher, at **£7,500**.

To receive a bursary or scholarship, you must be entitled to support under the [Student Finance England](#) criteria or the equivalent in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

If you have a degree from outside the UK, you should refer to the [overseas degree equivalency table](#) to see the bursaries available. You can also contact your training provider about your eligibility.

Trainees in physics, chemistry, maths, and languages with a 2:1 or above may apply for a teacher training scholarship with the appropriate professional body. With a 2:2, you'll need significant experience.

Teaching primary level mathematics

Trainees in primary level mathematics at least a B grade in A-level mathematics (or equivalent) will be eligible for a bursary of £6,000.

School Direct (salaried route)

For trainees on School Direct, the school pays your tuition fees and a salary. The amount depends on your location and subject. Trainees in maths or physics can earn up to £30,000 before deductions. School Direct trainees are not eligible for a bursary or scholarship but may be able to receive support towards living costs from Student Finance England or another regional provider.

BA Hons Primary Education with QTS

Students on the BA Hons Primary Education with QTS do not qualify for bursaries but may be eligible for a tuition fee loan and maintenance loan.

Early Years Teacher Status

The type and amount of financial support available depends on your eligibility and your highest relevant qualification.

Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (full-time)

A £7,000 grant is available to cover course fees. There are also bursaries of up to £5,000 for graduates with a first class degree, £4,000 for graduates with a 2:1, and £2,000 for graduates with a 2:2.

Postgraduate Certificate in Education (employment)

Funding of £14,000 is available: up to £7,000 for course fees; the remainder for costs incurred by your employer (e.g. supply cover or salary).

Further Education, Lifelong Learning (Full Time)

We are awaiting information about the availability of bursaries for the academic year 2018-2019 and will provide updates as soon as possible.

How bursaries are awarded

We will send you an application form once you have accepted your offer of a place. During registration, we check this together with your degree awards in the Student Centre.

Bursary payments are processed by your chosen teacher training provider. They are released in 10 monthly instalments from October to July, once you are fully registered.

Brexit: information for non-UK EU nationals and EEA citizens

EU nationals applying for teacher training in 2018/19 can still apply for bursaries / scholarships and a tuition fee loan. You must have lived in the European Economic Area or Switzerland for three years before the course begins.

EU citizens living here before the UK's withdrawal can continue their lives broadly unchanged. For more information, visit [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk).

Disclosure Barring Service

Before your course begins, you must obtain an [enhanced disclosure certificate](#) through the Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) and complete an Occupational Health Check. Without this, there may be delays to your funding

The Ann Packer Sports Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

If you're an elite sportsperson and decide to study a degree at the University of Greenwich, you could win a scholarship named after our Olympic gold medal-winning alumna, Ann Packer.

The Ann Packer Sports Scholarships provide up to £3,500 (plus up to £500 in support services) per year for full-time students.

Scholarship holders will be paid in two instalments throughout the year. Continued support in further years is conditional upon evidence of sustained high performance.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be considered for the Ann Packer Sports Scholarship:

- You are a new full-time undergraduate starting in 2019/2020.
- You have selected the University of Greenwich as a 'Firm' choice via UCAS.
- You'll be entering Year 0/1 of a FdA, BA, BEd, BSc, LLB, BEng, MEng or MMath programme at one of our three main campuses: Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway.
- You are a high-performing sportsperson who competes at county level or higher.

For 2019/20, Ann Packer Sports Scholarships are also available to postgraduates and to current students at years 2, 3 and 4 studying at a campus or at a partner college. If you meet the sporting performance criteria and would like to apply, submit an application form by 23 September 2019.

Priority will be given to applications from the following sports:

- American football
- Athletics
- Badminton
- Basketball
- Swimming
- Table-tennis
- Netball.

(However, all other BUCS Programme sports will be considered.)

If you meet the eligibility criteria, you must apply for the scholarship, together with evidence of your performance level and achievements.

The Greenwich Bursary

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

The Greenwich Bursary is worth £700 for new undergraduate students with a low household income.

We are committed to supporting students from a variety of backgrounds. As part of this commitment, the Greenwich Bursary offers £700 to new undergraduate students entering Year 0 or 1 who meet the eligibility criteria.

You receive £350 onto an Aspire Card by 8 December 2019. The second payment is made before 1 March 2020. The bursary is paid for one year only.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to receive the bursary:

- You are a fully-registered undergraduate student at the University of Greenwich
- You are [assessed to pay fees](#) at the home rate at over £6,165 per year
- You have been assessed by Student Finance England and have given consent for it to share your information with the University of Greenwich
- Your household income is below £25,000.

How to apply

You do not need to apply for the Greenwich Bursary.

This bursary is assessed and awarded automatically by the Funds, Awards and Bursaries team if you meet the criteria.

Conditions

- You are only eligible for **one** bursary or scholarship from the University of Greenwich. You will be awarded the highest-value award you are eligible for.
- Part-time students must be taking at least 60 credits in their first year (Year 0/1).

The Sanctuary Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate, Postgraduate

This scholarship is for an offer holder seeking asylum or with refugee status in the United Kingdom. It covers tuition and accommodation costs, plus a maintenance grant.

For the 2019/20 academic year, we will offer one scholarship (undergraduate or postgraduate) to an offer-holder who is seeking asylum or has refugee status in the United Kingdom and is not eligible for financial support.

Successful scholars will receive:

- Annual tuition fee waiver
- Maintenance support of £5,000
- Annual accommodation fee waiver.

Once you are awarded a status that allows you access to student finance (tuition-fee loans, etc.), you no longer receive the scholarship in subsequent academic years.

You must meet **all** eligibility criteria and be able to provide documentary evidence.

Am I eligible?

- You have been offered a full-time place on an undergraduate or postgraduate course at the University of Greenwich, commencing September 2019
- You will be studying at one of our three campuses: Greenwich, Avery Hill or Medway (except Medway School of Pharmacy)
- If studying with a Partner College, the tuition fee must be paid directly to the University of Greenwich (UoG)
- You are unable to access Student Finance (Tuition and Maintenance Loans) due to your current immigration status
- You do not already hold a qualification that is equal to or higher than the course you are applying for
- You are resident in the UK.

Immigration status

To be eligible for the Sanctuary Scholarship you must hold one of the following immigration statuses prior to your application to study at the University of Greenwich:

- UK asylum seeker
- UK discretionary leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
- UK limited leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
- Humanitarian protection (as a result of an asylum application)

You will also be eligible if you are a dependant of someone with one of the above immigration statuses.

William Hills Scholarship

- Level: Undergraduate
- Fee status: Home

The William Hills Scholarship offers six students £2,000 each year for the duration of their 4-year MEng Mechanical Engineering degree.

The scholarship is available to full-time MEng Mechanical Engineering students, as well as students who transfer from the BEng Mechanical Engineering to the MEng in Year 3.

The scholarships are awarded based on performance at the end of the first academic year.

Am I eligible?

You will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the William Hills Scholarship:

- You are a new entrant, studying the MEng Mechanical Engineering on a full-time basis at Medway Campus.
- You have at least 128 UCAS points from two or three A-Levels (including at least a B in A-level Maths). Level 3 Key Skills and General Studies are not included.
- Students on the BEng Mechanical Engineering who transfer to the third year of the MEng will also be eligible to receive the scholarship for their third and fourth years. These students will be identified and nominated by the Faculty.

How to apply

The Faculty will notify you if you meet the eligibility criteria.

The six winners will be those with the highest-grade average at the end of the first academic year, as identified by the Progression and Award Board.

Conditions

- All award winners take part in Faculty-organised promotional activity in local schools and colleges to highlight the course and scholarship to prospective applicants.
- Winners must maintain a grade average of at least 60% through each academic stage to keep receiving the award.

Further information

William Hills was an alumnus of the university who studied Mechanical Engineering at the former Woolwich Polytechnic. He was dedicated to the support and education of a new generation of engineers.

Following his own studies, he worked for the Royal Arsenal in Woolwich, eventually becoming the Chief Draftsman. It is through his work and generosity that, following his death, this scholarship was made available.
