Welcome to Greenwich!

As an international student, we want you to have the best possible experience at the University of Greenwich. The UK has some very strict immigration rules, and to ensure that your stay in the UK remains trouble-free, this guide contains some important information you need to know about your student visa.

Please read the following information carefully. You should keep this leaflet for the duration of your studies. If you have any questions, please contact the Student Centre or email **internationaladvice@gre.ac.uk**

Sponsorship of your visa

The University of Greenwich is the 'sponsor' for your student visa. As your sponsor, the university is responsible for guaranteeing your student status with UK Visas & Immigration (UKVI).

Sponsorship of your visa is conditional upon continued registration at the University of Greenwich. If you stop attending or leave the university, your visa may be cancelled.

If you are thinking about withdrawing or interrupting your studies, it is very important that you consider the visa implications and discuss this with your faculty or an International Student Advisor first.

Reporting to UKVI

As your sponsor, the university must inform UKVI if:

- you do not complete the registration process (you must do this every year)
- you stop attending your classes
- you interrupt your studies
- you withdraw (or are withdrawn) from your studies
- you change your programme
- you complete your programme earlier than expected

We will write to you after we have informed UKVI, and let you know what you need to do next.

Attendance Monitoring

The university will monitor your attendance in class. Most courses will record your attendance in at least one class per week. Records of your attendance are stored centrally and may be shared with UKVI.

Attendance is usually recorded by scanning your student ID card over a reader at the front of the class. You should always take your ID card with you and remember to register your attendance in all your classes.

If you fail to meet the attendance requirements as specified by your faculty or programme handbook, you will be withdrawn from your studies.

Sponsorship Policy

All decisions regarding student visa sponsorship are taken in accordance with the university's sponsorship policy. You can find a copy of this on our website:

Conditions of Student Visa Sponsorship

The University will act as your student visa sponsor for the duration of your visa, subject to the following conditions.

Please read these carefully as your visa may be cancelled if you do not follow these rules:

You must:

1. Complete the registration process every year.
2. Check your visa states the University of Greenwich sponsor number - 4E4NJQDA7. If your visa has a different sponsor number on it, go to the Student Centre immediately. Visas sponsored by other institutions are not valid for study at Greenwich.
3. Attend all of your classes and/or meetings with your supervisor. If you are sick, you may be asked to provide medical evidence.
If you need to take a few days off, you must complete an 'authorised absence' form and have this approved in advance.
4. Submit all of your coursework on time and attend all of your exams.
5. Pay your tuition fees on time.
If you are finding it difficult to pay your fees, please visit the Student

Finance and Financial Support Team at the Student Centre or email studentfinance@gre.ac.uk

6. Keep your personal details up-to-date on the portal. This includes your term-time address, email, and phone number.
7. Follow the work restrictions stated on your visa. Most students are allowed to work up to 20 hours per week. It is a criminal offence to work more hours than you are permitted.
If you decide to work part-time, you must not:
 - Fill a full-time, permanent vacancy
 - Be self-employed or engage in any form of business activity (except as an 'employee')
 - Work as a doctor/dentist in training
 - Work as a professional sportsperson or sports coachRemember that you are here to study. Employment must never interfere with your attendance or university work.
8. Ensure your passport/visa is valid throughout your studies. If your passport or visa is due to end, you must renew it before it expires. The university will withdraw you if you do not have a valid passport or visa.
9. Show the university your original passport, visa, qualifications, and ATAS certificate (if applicable). If you renew your documents, you must show us the new documents within 10 days.
- 10 Inform the university immediately of any change to your immigration status or nationality.
