
Local Area Guide Medway Campus

- The Medway Campus has a rich naval history.
 Its red-brick buildings were previously a Royal Navy base. Nelson's flagship HMS Victory was built at Chatham's Historic Dockyard.
- The campus also has amazing cafés and bars, including those in Pembroke and Pilkington buildings. It has an attractive piazza-style area with outdoor seating which is ideal for events. There are also plenty of green spaces to relax and study, with a tennis court if you are feeling sporty.

Thomas Waghorn Statue: recently made famous by 'River Medway'


Escape Plan Live: can you escape in time?

Transport by train

Train services are provided by **Southeastern**. There are two stations near the campus: **Chatham** and **Gillingham**.

Transport by bus

Most bus services in Medway are operated by Arriva. There is a service from Chatham bus station to the campus every 10 minutes most of the day stopping on the campus (Service 1), or just outside in Dock Road (Service 2).

University of Greenwich students can get 70% off the cost of travel with Arriva throughout Medway and Kent! More information here.
